# **RABBI'S FORUM**

It is hard to know exactly what to wish you all right now. Summer is just about upon us. As I write these words the youngsters in our Congregation are finishing up the end of the school year. In a normal year they would be looking forward to heading out to Camp—Sleep Away, Day, Sports, Arts and Science-the list goes on and on. But this is not a normal year. In a normal year many of you would be looking forward to summer travel. In my own family we had a great trip planned for this summer, but this is not a normal year. In a normal year I would be telling you all not to forget to use sunscreen and to take bug spray, and to not forget all of the Hebrew that you've learned. I would remind you to think of me from time to time as I would be missing you. But again, this is not a normal year.

So what should I wish for you all right now?

How about a summer of peace. How about a summer that has less anxiety and stress and fear than the last two months. That would be something wonderful for this summer.

How about a summer of connection. Human beings are by nature gregarious social beings. Most of us do not do well with long periods of being kept apart from one another. # CANTOR'S COLUMN

# Cantor Judith Borden Ovadia

My friends, it has been so long since we have sung together in person. I miss you! This unprecedented time we are living in has brought so many challenges. There is, first and foremost, the incalculable loss of life, and the grief, illness, and hardship experienced by so many. Some have felt this in our own families or among our friends. Others have experienced it second-hand, as our neighbors and fellow citizens have been stricken. The burden of this collective trauma weighs heavy on our hearts. We pray for a speedy end to all sickness, death, and suffering caused by this pandemic.

Personally, I have also struggled to manage the stress and anxiety brought on by the loss of control. I'm used to planning several months, even years, ahead. Things don't always go according to my plans, but it helps me to know that I have a plan in place and a reliable expectation of how things are going to play out. Since the pandemic, I have to function without knowing what is going to happen next week, let alone next month.

Planning for my children has been especially difficult. When the URJ finally decided to cancel summer camps, a difficult and principled decision, my daughter was deeply disappointed, despite having prepared herself for the news. That same week, we heard that school would be very different next fall, and we started to imagine how that might look. Even though we had been warned to expect major changes since the beginning of the pandemic, this was when the truth began to sink in for many. Some reacted with shock. Others reacted with anger.

The majority of folks understand that a virus doesn't yield to political pressure, and that the precautions advised by the medical community are the best way to prevent more disease and death. It is a vocal and belligerent minority who protest having to wear masks in public and question whether Covid-19 even exists. This minority, unfortunately, impacts the rest of us. No one wants to see more people get sick, and no one, certainly, wants these past few months of quarantine to have been in vain. If we end up having to "do-over" the Stay-At-Home restrictions, the effect on the economy, and on our mental health, will be even more devastating.

When the Israelites left Egypt and wandered in the wilderness, they experienced frequent rebellions from groups within their masses. In the Torah portion, *"Beha'alotecha,"* we read about a group of discontented "riff-raff," who rile up the Israelites with their complaining. They reminisce about how great life used to be in the good old days. They protest how difficult life has become in their new reality. God responds with fiery fury until Moses' and Aaron's efforts bring restraint. The wilderness is a metaphor for any place or time of chaos. It is frightening. We lose our bearing. We struggle to find our way. At times, we feel we are utterly abandoned. The wilderness is also the place where growth and transformation can occur. It takes commitment and courage, but we know it is possible.

God gives Moses and the Israelites inspiration through the journey. The commandments offer tasks and imagery to guide and prepare them for their transformation. God prescribes projects requiring the work of their hands, craftsmanship, art, manual labor. Not only are they commanded regarding the building of the tabernacle, the Israelites receive detailed descriptions of what awaits them on the other side of the Jordan, at the end of their arduous journey. They travel, focusing on visions of a land "flowing with milk and honey."

We, too, need to put our hands to work as we pass through our wilderness. Planting, painting, baking, cleaning, writing – these are all examples of tasks that focus our hands and our minds, and allow us to keep marching on. We also need to imagine what awaits us on the other side of the Jordan. Playing with our grandchildren, taking our parents out to dinner, returning to our jobs and our schools, gathering as a congregation in our sanctuary – this is our Promised Land.

One of my favorite Hassidic stories (you've heard it before, I'm sure) is told by the Rebbe of Tzantz. A man is wandering for days, lost in a forest. He finally comes upon another man and, relieved, he asks him how to get out. "I, too, am lost," replies the other man. "I can only tell you that the paths I have tried lead nowhere. Let's join forces and find the way together."

This is the pathway through the wilderness. We are all uncertain, we are all somewhat lost. The only way out is to unite, and search for the path, hand in hand.

I hope you will continue to join me for Kabbalat Shabbat, songs and prayers to prepare for Erev Shabbat, 6:00 pm on Fridays. Look for the videos posted on our Facebook page, Youtube, and templeshaareishalom.com. Stay safe and stay connected!

Dear Congregant,

May 2020

We hope that you and your families are staying safe during these difficult times. The Annual Congregational Meeting for Temple Shaarei Shalom has been cancelled due to the Covid 19 pandemic. The Board of Trustees has determined that we will conduct business through the mail and email for the remainder of the pandemic.

Business items still needing attention prior to the July 1, 2020 start of the fiscal year include Election of Officers and Approving a Budget for fiscal year 2020-2021. Due to the uncertainty of the current times the Board believes that we should not present a budget for approval and maintain our spending per the current budget, therefore until a time at which we can reasonably forecast our income and expenses we will remain with the status quo.

Please know that in an effort to ease some of the stress and burden that we are all facing during the pandemic, the decision was made to <u>not</u> implement any increases on either temple dues or religious school fees. In all transparency, the budget was going to include a dues and religious school fee increase; but at this time, our main goal is to continue to provide consistency, stability, and the sure knowledge that whether onsite or virtual, our Temple remains a source of comfort and peace for you and your family. For those who will need financial assistance please return the enclosed form by June 15, 2020 by mail or email (temple@templeshaareishalom.com).

Some of this decision was possible because of the leveraging of the SBA PPP Loan/Grant, as well as the generosity of our congregation, community partners and staff that gave what they could to the Temple Relief Fund. We raised over \$46,000; and there are just not enough words to express my deepest gratitude. If you have not yet contributed to this effort, please consider making a donation to the Temple Relief Fund.
