

RABBI'S FORUM



Rabbi Anthony Fratello

I had a conversation with a congregant recently, who asked about Saturday Morning Services. They expressed frustration that they couldn't come for worship. I said, "Who told you that you couldn't come?!?" "Rabbi... isn't Saturday Morning just for the Bar/Bat Mitzvah Family?"

When we started our Religious School 20 years ago and our B'nei Mitzvah Programs, there were certain things we KNEW we wanted to avoid. First and foremost we wanted to avoid being a "Bar Mitzvah Mill," where kids and families get churned in and out with little or no thought beyond getting up on the Bema one day. Have we been successful? In some ways yes, and probably in other ways, no. Part of that ethos, however, was to have the Bar/Bat Mitzvah Ceremony take place in the context of the Congregation. Historically, that is what the Bar Mitzvah was all about, a young man leading the congregation in worship as an Adult Jew. If there is no congregation, how is it that the young man (or woman in the Liberal Jewish Context) can be recognized as an adult? Hence the fact that B'nei Mitzvah happen at TSS at a regularly scheduled worship service.

Parenthetically, this is part of why we do not have Havdallah B'nei Mitzvah here. If we had a regular, weekly Havdallah Service, I would have no problem having Havdallah B'nei Mitzvah. But without having a regular Havdallah Service, we would be having a service solely for the purpose of B'nei Mitzvah. And again, that is not what we are all about.

It is true that in the Reform Movement, Friday Night has taken the place of Saturday Morning as the "main" service of the week. But I will let you in on something, Saturday Mornings are the BEST kept secret in our congregation. When we have a young man or woman ascending the Bema, it is amazing to watch the pride and joy of their family at their accomplishment. On most weeks there are few dry eyes in the house. On those Saturdays when we don't have a Bar or Bat Mitzvah, we have a casual informal service after Torah Study, that itself is intimate and unique. Either way... you cannot lose.

"Rabbi... can I really attend on Saturday Mornings?" We would LOVE to have you.

CANTOR'S COLUMN

Last week I saw, like many of you, the musical Hamilton. I had seen it once before, on Broadway, and I've been obsessed with the music and the lyrics for three years. The genius of Lin-Manuel Miranda's score, how he uses the idiom of hip hop to capture the essence of the characters and conflicts of our founding fathers— these remarkable qualities have been written about by so many. But I've been thinking a lot about how this incredible, epic retelling of our nation's founding is similar to the story of Purim.

Hamilton's theme, repeated many times in the course of the play, claims that you have no control "who lives, who dies, who tells your story." This resonates with the tale of the Jews of Shushan. The evil Haman plots to annihilate all the Jews, casting lots to determine the day of their destruction. It takes the courage of one person, Esther, to rise up and save her people. Her cousin Mordecai compels her to address the king on behalf of the Jews. For all she knows, he reminds her, she may have been elevated to her royal position just for this purpose. So she musters her courage and asks the king to spare her life, and the lives of her people. As the song goes, she does not throw away her shot.

Who lives? The Jews. Who dies? Haman and his sons. Who tells their story? We do, every year, through the Megillah reading. Mordecai has letters sent throughout King Ahashuerus' kingdom Telling the tale of the brave Queen Esther and the evil Haman, and announcing the commemoration that becomes Purim for all time. The common threads between these two things, Hamilton and Purim, remind us that we cannot control the unexpected storms of life that buffet us this way and that. We can, and must, however, stand up for what we believe in, even when doing so risks everything, even our life. Ultimately our legacy is endowed, not through the treasure we amass, but through the our courage and righteous deeds in the face of hardship and danger.

Join us for a lively Megillah Reading on the morning of March 8, 10:15 am, followed by our annual Purim Carnival! Hope to see you there!
