RABBI'S FORUM

Rabbi Anthony Fratello, MAHL, DD

In the years that I have been fortunate enough to be the Rabbi of Temple Shaarei Shalom, there are a handful of things that have been constants.

Some of these constants have been positives: We have always had a group of Friday Night Regulars. We have always had an active and involved PTO—in fact, some of our GREATEST accomplishments have come from the hardworking of our Parent Teacher Organization. Our members have always felt pride in our building and our facility.

To be fair, we have also had some constants that have been... challenges: We have always struggled to recruit and retain volunteers. Don't get me wrong, the volunteers we have are AMAZING, but there never seem to be enough. We have always struggled to raise money in our congregation. Like the old joke says, "There is more than enough money in the pews, the problem is that members do not wish to part with it." We have frequently argued about the exact same issues, in the exact same ways, often times with the exact same people. Again, NONE of these are particularly unique to TSS.

One of our greatest constants, to be true, one of the things that we should rightfully take pride in is our goal of being an open and welcoming congregation. THAT has been a mantra of ours from practically the beginning of my time here. Some of you will still remember "Uncle Arthur"—Arthur Abravanel (z"l) who was 5th President of the Congregation, who used to say, "Come feel the warmth!" We may rightfully take pride in thinking of ourselves in this way—and no doubt, you can find many people here who will tell you that that was precisely why they found a home here. At the same time, however, and again in the spirit of fairness, there are others who will tell you that that is NOT who our congregation is.

Being an open and welcoming congregation takes many forms. Yes, it means being gracious to guests and members alike. It means making room at our tables, in

our rows, and in our hearts for new faces and new perspectives. But it also means being tolerant of what people can and cannot do, what they can and cannot afford, how they can and cannot dress when they come to worship or programs.

These words are not meant to single out any person or group; each of us bears our own responsibility in making Temple Shaarei Shalom the community we wish it to be. I too must bear the burden; there have been times when I have not always been the open welcoming leader that I should always strive to be. But if we learn anything from our tradition it is that there is always room for change.

The Jewish World is changing. Congregational life is changing. If we wish to continue to be who and what we want to be, we must also change as well. This does not mean that we should abandon who we are, or the values that make us so, rather that we should try to adapt and shape those values to a world that is SO far removed from what we remember in our youth.

During the Festival of Hanukkah, when we kindle the lights, we are reminded of the victory of the Maccabees over the forces of tyranny and oppression. Celebrate that. But do not forget that that deliverance did not come in a vacuum. The Miracle that God wrought for our ancestors came about through our work together. So it was for them, so it should be for us.

May your Winter Holidays Season be filled with light and gladness. May this be a season of peace for us and for all the world.

Cantor's Corner

When my husband Ian was preparing for conversion, we attended a sixteen-week *Introduction to Judaism* course. During the class we discussed numerous issues Jews-By-Choice may face as part of the transition into a Jewish life. We talked about how nostalgia and sadness associated with the “loss” of Christmas can be difficult to overcome. For Ian, this was not the case. The Christmas experience was one he would not miss, and I was grateful for that, assuming this would make our lives easier when we had children. Of course, I forgot to take into account the feelings and traditions of his extended family.

When we announced our engagement to Ian’s parents, the first question was “Will there be a priest at the wedding?” After Ian explained that there would be a rabbi officiating because by then he would, indeed, be Jewish, the second question from my future mother-in-law was “Can I still have Santa Claus?” At the time, thrilled that things were going so smoothly, I immediately answered, “Yes!” I mean, how harmless could Santa be?

As we transitioned into parenthood, we also began the journey of navigating the divide between two traditions. There is nothing remotely Christmas-y in our home, but I knew that come mid-December, the presents would arrive from “Santa,” better known as Nana and Pop Pop. Santa even sent a personal letter to Blake for his first Christmas which Ian hid from me for a few weeks, nervous about my reaction!

How many of us experience this? How many of your children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, sisters, or brothers face this dilemma: how do you peacefully meld two different families, different traditions, and different values? What is more important, *our* beliefs or *their* feelings? Because, ultimately, while it may come out as “Christmas versus Hanukkah,” the underlying issue is “Inclusion versus Alienation.” And, since I know that it is not easy for my in-laws to face the reality that the son they raised in the Catholic tradition now lives an active Jewish life, do I need to make it even harder by limiting their pathways toward connecting with their grandchildren?

So how do I, as clergy in the Jewish tradition, face the winter holiday season with regard to Ian’s family? Well, my focus is on what I believe is the most important part: *shalom bayit*, peace in the home. This is not just the physical home, but our extended family as well. My goal is to maintain happy, healthy relationships with Ian’s family, even if it means compromising some of my own beliefs in order to make room for their traditions.

Does that mean I have a Christmas tree? No. Christmas is at Nana and Pop Pop’s. Did Santa ever visit our house? Still no. However, if Santa happened to drop something off for the boys at Nana and Pop’s and they shipped it to us, well, hey, who was I to stop Santa? The boys, now teenagers, made their way through childhood, understanding that everyone lights up the darkest time of the year a little differently, but we are all trying to celebrate our blessings and bring each other some needed joy.

We have the ability to scar our children: with words, with fights, with anger. It’s our job as parents to model good and healthy relationships. We must choose our battles wisely, because ultimately, Santa Claus cannot hurt our children, but a fight over “his” gifts could mean war.

How ever you and your family observe the winter holiday season, I hope that, especially this year, it is full of light, love and shalom.

Director of Congregational Learning

Nancy Bossov, RJE

What should a child know about Judaism by the time they become Bar/Bat Mitzvah? What should a child know about Judaism by the time they graduate High School? What do they need to be prepared for living Jewishly at college and beyond?

These are some of the questions our faculty is beginning to grapple with as we dive into the process of creating a curriculum for the Religious School in the coming years. There's not one answer, nor should there be but how interesting it would be to compare our individual childhood experiences, both positive and negative, that led us to where we are today and helped us know who we are.

I like to know WHAT we need to teach before I decide about HOW to teach it. If we're teaching about Shtetl Life in Eastern Europe, is it more important for the kids to know the dates of world events or how the villages got along? Won't they get an authentic taste of Shtetl life if they reenact a wedding including the prayers, music, and dances our ancestors danced? What about the *Halutzim*; The Pioneers in the early days of the State of Israel?!? They turned deserts into lush fields of crops; agriculture is our heritage! And after a long day of hard work in the field, what do you think they did in the evenings to relax and feel a sense of community? They danced and sang songs about their lives and their dreams.

When we study all the different places where Jews have lived, imagine how "cool" it would be to learn a Sephardic dance, or a song sung in Ladino? Yiddish in Europe? Ladino in Spain! Hebrew in Israel! Farsi in Iran! Who knew our People had so many languages?

All of our People's life experiences have accumulated to weave a rich tapestry of deep colors and intricate weavings representing our history. It is these patterns of weavings that we are venturing to explore through many mediums, reaching and speaking to all of our different kinds of learners. There's a lot more to Judaism than what's written in books!

Many thanks to Marcia Arena & Debbie Gambarrotti & all the volunteers who made the Boutique so wonderful this year! Your hard work will benefit many students in our Religious School. Those of us who reap the benefits pay tribute to you and all your creative ideas! Your success is our success!
