# RABBI'S FORUM

My mother, of blessed memory, was a successful, hardworking CPA. As such I KNEW that she would head off to work one morning in early February and I would not see her again until April 15. That was just part and parcel of my life. Over the years people have on occasion asked me, what's the most difficult time of year? Most assume I would say, "Well... the High Holidays." Or perhaps even Peaskh. Not really. The most challenging time of my life professionally is from about the middle of January to the end of March. Why?

There are no holidays. In an average year there is nothing particularly earth-shattering that occurs in that stretch. I have come to refer to this as "The slog!"

I am willing to bet that each of you has your own slog. I am willing to bet that each of you has your own particular time of year that is just tough. Maybe it is around when you have particularly poignant Yahrzeits. Maybe it is during your own times of busyness at work. Maybe it is during times when your family is in transition. Either way, we all find those times in our lives when things just seem to conspire to get us down.

In my experience, I have found several techniques that make this time easier to bear.

Number 1: Rabbi Fratello's Gold Rule. If you do not take care of yourself, you are no darn good to anyone else! Make sure you are doing enough to care for your own wellbeing. Physically, emotionally, and yes, mentally. If you need to take a break—if you need to schedule in that break in anticipation, do it! But make sure that you are okay. What is the line they say during the safety demonstration on an airplane? "Adjust your own mask before you help someone else."

Number 2: Share your life. If you ask anyone who has been through a significant loss, and has been part of a support group, they will tell you: It is easier to face a challenge when you are not doing it alone. Knowing that others are dealing with challenges, knowing that others are looking for their own peace of mind, helps. It really does. You may doubt that you may deny that, but I encourage you to give it a try.

Number 3: Be Patient. Nothing lasts forever. Even the most difficult and challenging of times will eventually

give way to something else. Our own people's history reveals this fact. How many times have we languished only to eventually find our way to a new and better future? So, it was for them, so shall it be for you.

As your Rabbi, I will tell you that coming to Temple, engaging with your synagogue family, helps make each of these easier. You can nurture your soul. You can be reminded that you are never alone. But most importantly, you can be reminded that God is always looking out for us and will bring us to the Promised Land.

# Cantor's Corner

As we begin the month of February, grocery stores, pharmacies and stationery shops have become seas of red and pink announcing that Saint Valentine’s Day is upon us, a decidedly non-Jewish holiday. Did you know, though, that we have our own Day of Love whose origins date back over two thousand years?

Tu B’Av, known as the Jewish “holiday of love,” has ancient roots dating back to the time of the Second Temple in Jerusalem. Its origins are somewhat mysterious, but according to the Talmud (Taanit 30b-31a), the 15th of Av (Tu B’Av) was a day of joy and celebration, particularly for matchmaking and unity among the tribes of Israel. One of the key historical reasons for the holiday was the lifting of a ban that had prevented different Israelite tribes from intermarrying. Tu B’Av also marked the end of the prohibition against marrying members of the tribe of Benjamin, which had been imposed following the incident of the “Concubine of Gibeah” (Judges 19-21). Additionally, during the Second Temple period, Tu B’Av became known as a day when young, unmarried women would dress in white garments and dance in the vineyards, allowing potential suitors to find their matches.

Tu B’Av also had agricultural significance. It marked the beginning of the grape harvest and the end of the wood-cutting season for the Temple altar. The latter was a crucial task, as wood needed to be collected and dried in advance to avoid worm infestations, ensuring that sacrifices could be offered properly. Because Tu B’Av symbolized the conclusion of this work, it was seen as a day of rejoicing.

In modern times, Tu B’Av has experienced a revival, especially in Israel, where it is celebrated as a day of love, similar to Valentine’s Day in Western cultures. While it is not a biblical or halachically mandated holiday, it has become popular for weddings, engagements, and romantic celebrations. Many couples take the opportunity to express their love, and events such as concerts, parties, and special gatherings are common. The white-clothing tradition is sometimes re-enacted, especially in religious communities.

Religiously, Tu B’Av is observed with a more minor emphasis compared to other Jewish holidays. There are no formal prohibitions or mitzvot associated with the day, but it is considered an auspicious time for matchmaking and finding one’s destined partner. Some people recite additional prayers or study texts related to love and relationships, while others take inspiration from the historical aspects of the day to reflect on themes of unity and renewal.

Overall, Tu B’Av has transformed from an ancient festival of joy and marriage into a modern celebration of love and togetherness. What could be bad about that? Only that you have to wait until the middle of the summer for the month of Av!

# Director of Congregational Learning

Our Adult Learning & Edutainment program has just begun a new adult Hebrew class taught by our very own Judy Rosmarin! Ten brave souls have taken on the task of “FINALLY Learning Hebrew!” So many of us have been in Hebrew classes on and off over the years and somehow, haven’t been able to grasp it well enough to follow along in the prayerbook at services.

This educator wonders why! If you think about America’s structure for learning other foreign languages like French, Spanish, German, etc. in Monday-Friday school, it is offered several times a week. The Romance languages all use the same alphabet as English whereas Hebrew has its own alphabet. Most Hebrew classes (outside of Day School/Magnet Schools) are 1-3 hours per week at most. So, it seems like we’re setting ourselves up for a huge challenge from the start! Take into account the 8-12 weeks off during the summer and every year we have to backtrack to remember and review!

Yet, we pursue. For both adults and children, taking 5-10 minutes a day to look at, think about, try to remember, review, practice the Hebrew letters, vowels, and words can make all the difference. I applaud those adults trying again! I applaud the families who choose to support their kids’ learning in Religious School! Know that the challenge can be addressed successfully with just a bit of repetition and consistency in between class or online tutoring sessions. Parents can ask the children to teach them what they’ve learned. Ask them about HOW to piece together consonants and vowels to create words. Ask them to read a few lines from a prayer or a blessing they’ve recently worked on. Parents’ interest gives invaluable positive reinforcement! And for our adult learners, look to each other to review, remember, repeat, and practice!

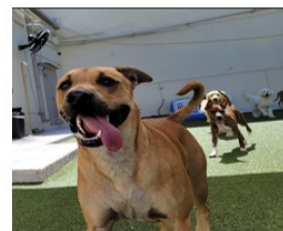

As we write this article, we are hopeful that the hostage releases will continue and that all will return to their families, friends, and communities. However, we must never forget the brave IDF defenders who have died in this war—841 soldiers, officers and reservists and 58 police officers at this time. Before soldiers go into battle, their commanders ask them to write a letter to be delivered to their loved ones in case the soldiers do not return. Here is one of them :

I'm writing this message to you on my way to the base. If you're reading this, something probably happened to me. As you know me, I'm likely the happiest person right now. It's not for nothing that I was about to fulfill my dream soon. I'm happy and grateful for the privilege I'll have to defend our beautiful country and the people of Israel.

Even if something happens to me, I don't allow you to sink into sadness. I had the privilege to fulfill my dream and destiny, and be sure that I'm looking down at you from above with a huge smile. I'll probably sit next to Grandpa and catch up, each of us sharing our experiences and how things have changed between wars. Maybe we'll also talk some politics, ask him what he thinks.

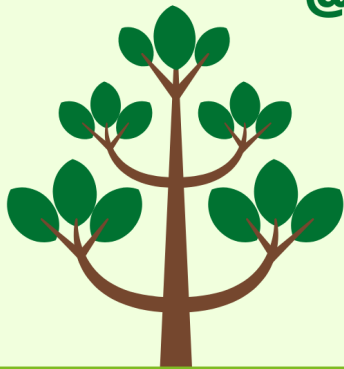
If, God forbid, you're sitting shiva, turn it into a week of friends, family, and fun. Have food, meat of course, beers, sweet drinks, seeds, tea, and definitely Mom's cookies. Laugh, listen to stories, meet all my other friends you haven't met yet. Really? I'm jealous of you. I'd like to sit there and see everyone.

Another very, very important point. If, God forbid, I fall into captivity, alive or dead, I'm not willing for a single soldier or civilian to be harmed because of some deal for my release. I don't allow you to run a campaign or struggle or anything like that. I'm not willing for terrorists to be released in exchange for me. In no way, shape, or deal. Please don't violate my words. I'll say it again, I left home without even being called up for reserve duty. I'm full of pride and a sense of mission, and I've always said that if I need to die, I hope it will be in defense of others and the country. Jerusalem, I have set watchmen, may the day come when I'll be one of them.

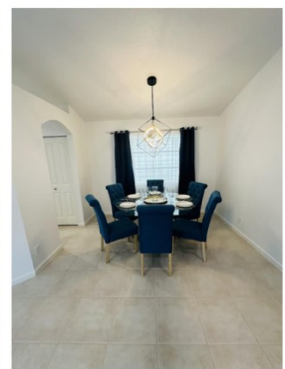
