RABBI'S FORUM

In a few days' time most of you will likely be gathering with your family and or friends, to celebrate Passover. Pesakh is the most commonly observed of all Jewish Holidays. Even those who otherwise are not Jewishly inclined the remainder of the year, will make an effort to do... SOMETHING... come the 14th of Nisan!

Then comes the dramatic moment when we drag out the Seder Plate—hopefully, we cleaned it well enough before we put it away last year!

When looking at the Plate, the need for the Six Different items becomes immediately clear. Some of them we know well, even if we do not understand the reasoning:

The Roasted Shank Bone and the Egg are actually part of the same commandment. We have been taught that the Shank Bone is there to remind us of the Passover Sacrifice that was offered in the days of old, and the Egg is symbolic of the cycle of rebirth in the springtime. In truth, however, these two objects are on the Seder Plate because the Talmud teaches us that the Seder Meal must be a FEAST! What differentiates a feast from a regular meal? Two cooked dishes! The Shank Bone and Egg: These represent our two cooked dishes.

Then we have the Maror and the Haroset. These two, similarly, are part of the same commandment. They represent the hard work that our ancestors were forced to do in the Land of Egypt. The Maror (which most people eat in the form of Horseradish—Extra Points if it is Best's Horseradish!), is bitter, and reminds us of how the Egyptians Embittered the lives of our ancestors when they were slaves in Egypt. The Haroset is meant to resemble the mortar that our people made use of when laboring on Pharaoh's many projects. In eating these, we connect in a visceral way with generations past.

Then there are the last two, the Karpas and the Hazeret. Karpas is easy: The Green Leafy vegetable is the First thing eaten at the Seder. We dip it in Salt Water to remember the tears of our ancestors who toiled at hard labor. The Hazeret, however? That is more difficult!

There is nowhere to be found in Tradition about why we are to eat the Hazeret. There is no commandment for it. It is not described in the Talmud when discussing how The Passover Meal is to be prepared and consumed. It is

almost as though the Rabbis put it on the plate and then forgot to tell us why.

A big part of our Seder Meal is spending time talking about the Exodus Story. What does it mean that God visited the plagues upon the Egyptians? Why are there four cups of wine, why are there four questions? Why isn't Moses mentioned in the Seder (traditionally)? Why is this night different from all other nights?

When you gather with your family, and you eat your festive meal, take a moment to ask a question about the Hazeret. Why is it there? How does its presence (or absence) impact us? I would be curious to learn what wisdom your family may come up with!

From our family to your family, may your Passover be filled with joy and celebration, and not a small measure of redemption!

Cantor's Corner

Recently, I was asked to teach a “Passover 101” class for a local Hadassah group. Not convinced that I knew everything about Pesach, I ended up doing a bit of a “deep dive” on the internet to see if there might be obscure factoids that I could share to make the presentation more interesting for those who might already be well-versed in all things Passover. I was not disappointed!

Have you ever wondered why some seder plates have five circles for maror (bitter herb), karpas (parsley), zeroa (shank bone), charoset and beitzah (egg), but some have a sixth circle for “chazeret?” Chazeret has long been defined as bitter greens and many people use lettuce. In reality, though, we don’t know exactly what the chazeret is supposed to be. It’s not mentioned in the Haggadah and no specific instructions exist about it. It’s also valid to ask why we would need another bitter item when we already have the maror.

Because the Exodus occurred over three-thousand years ago and the Haggadah developed just under two-thousand years ago, it makes sense that some origins would get lost over time. However, in his book, *Settings of Silver*, Rabbi Stephen Wylen offers an explanation.

The Passover Seder borrows from Greco-Roman dining customs. (For example, wealthy Romans reclined on three cushioned couches, or a triclinium, while dining. Sound familiar?) Rabbi Wylen explains that Romans were really into lettuce and would begin a formal meal by dipping lettuce into a fruit sauce. When we read in the Four Questions, “Why on this night do we dip twice?” Wylen suggests that it is referring to two separate “dippings:” the first as the appetizer of the lettuce in fruit sauce and the second when we dip the parsley in salt water.

To add to this, apparently charoset was originally more like the consistency of Chinese duck sauce, which makes the idea of “dipping” more understandable. In modernity, people commonly explained the second dipping as the Hillel sandwich of matza, maror and charoset, but really, that’s more of a “piling” than a “dipping.” Unfortunately, because charoset was moved to the Hillel sandwich, chazeret was abandoned by its partner and often left off of most seder plates.

Interestingly, Rabbi Larry Wilder has a possible explanation as to why we’ve seen a resurgence of chazeret on the seder plate. As mass production of seder plates became possible, a popular design was the Magen David. Having six sections on the plate meant that a sixth symbol became necessary, and the chazeret was returned to its place on the seder plate for balance.

We don’t know for sure if these explanations are fact, but they will certainly give you something to talk about at your seder! Whether you celebrate with family or friends, I wish you all a Zissen Pesach: a very sweet and meaningful Passover.

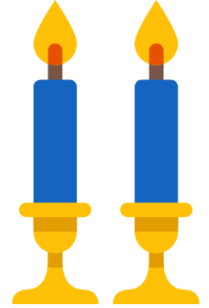

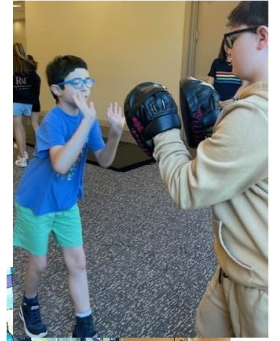

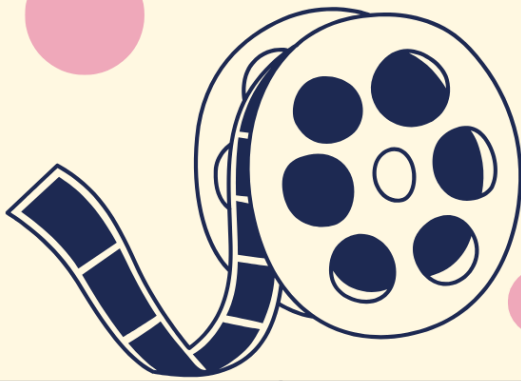

From our President

Earlier this year, I wrote to tell you about the upcoming World Zionist Congress elections. Well, that time is here and voting in this is critical to us as Reform Jews. Voting is open from now to May 4, 2025.

Understanding the World Zionist Congress

The WZC serves as the paramount decision-making assembly for global Jewry, influencing key policies and funding allocations that impact Jewish communities worldwide and within Israel. It is a forum where diverse Jewish voices converge to shape the future of the Jewish state and the broader Jewish world. Importantly, the WZC determines the distribution of significant financial resources, affecting institutions and initiatives that align with our values.

Why Your Vote Matters

Participating in the WZC elections is not merely a procedural act; it is a profound expression of our agency and responsibility as Reform Jews. Our collective vote has the power to:

Advance Pluralism and Equality: By supporting the Reform slate, we advocate for an Israel that embraces religious diversity, ensuring that non-Orthodox streams of Judaism receive recognition and support. This promotes a society where all expressions of Jewish identity are valued.

Champion Social Justice: Our movement's enduring commitment to justice propels initiatives that address discrimination and support marginalized communities within Israel. Voting Reform empowers organizations like the Israel Religious Action Center to continue their vital work in these areas.

Support Progressive Causes: A vote for the Reform slate ensures funding for programs that uphold gender equality, LGBTQ+ inclusion, and pathways to peace—core tenets of our Reform values.

The Reform Slate: Vote Reform #3

Our "Vote Reform" slate, listed as #3 on the ballot, is deeply committed to a strong and secure Israel, working in close partnership with our Israeli Reform Movement. A vote for this slate is a vote for our shared values: equality, democracy, pluralism, justice, and peace in Israel.

Our Collective Responsibility

As members of the Reform Jewish community, we are called upon to engage actively in shaping the future of Israel and the Jewish people. Our participation in the WZC elections is a tangible manifestation of our commitment to the principles we hold dear. By casting our votes for the Vote Reform (#3) slate, we contribute to building an Israel that reflects the inclusive and progressive values we cherish.

Let us seize this moment to make a meaningful impact. I urge each of you to participate in the WZC elections and to encourage others within our community to do the same. Together, we can ensure that our vision for a just and pluralistic Israel is realized.

The March Board Meeting prepares us for the Congregation's Annual Meeting May 12.

As you know, certain business materials must be received by the Congregation prior to the Annual Meeting. To this end, the Board accepted the Nomination Committee's recommendation and the Executive Directors' Budget recommendation which will be sent to the congregation ahead of the annual meeting. When Jay Levine transitions to Past President, he will begin a Leadership Development Program intended for those who will be active in the Congregation on Committees, Auxiliaries, and as Board Members. With the re-implementation of this initiative, the Board hopes to develop an ongoing, knowledgeable cohort that will be in a position to lead us in the coming years.

Nancy Bossov updated the Board on the Religious School. She spoke of how she has met with Rabbi, Cantor, and groups of parents to obtain their input on school matters and, as a result, will be implementing a revised, updated curriculum (literally, a course of study or guideline to what is to be taught).

In our ongoing efforts to recruit and retain members, the Membership Committee will be re-structured.

The Long-Range Planning/Program Committee will hold a meeting with all those responsible for congregational programs to review what is presently planned for the coming year and to assure ongoing, meaningful programs to continue to meet the needs and wishes of our congregants. This past year has seen the seeds of cooperation between committees and auxiliaries and the opportunity to grow in this area.

There will be a monitored Virtual Suggestion Box on-line for program suggestions. These suggestions will be reviewed by the Program Committee and forwarded for implementation.

As our Congregation population changes, so, too, does our Board reflect these changes...as it seeks to "grow from strength to strength."
