She learned more in one year than she had in other years at a different congregation.”

Now, obviously, not everyone has the same experience. For each person who might say THIS, I could probably find others who would say, THAT! This person then asked me: “Rabbi, what is the congregation doing to try to attract new members?”

Make no mistake, this is the KEY question, and it is one that we have asked many times and in many different ways. The answers we have arrived at have taken many different forms. Cantor's Corner

During my vacation last month, I did something I had never done before: I visited Camp Coleman, the Union for Reform Judaism's regional sleep away camp nestled in the Georgia mountains. It was meant to be a brief side trip while my family and I were vacationing nearby in Helen. My original plan was simple—drop off care packages for our Temple Shaarei Shalom campers. But I was invited to stay for lunch and take a tour of the grounds. I had no idea the day would end up being so meaningful—both for me and, as it turned out, for Camp Coleman too.

When I arrived, I followed the car in front of me, and we both parked outside the cafeteria. Imagine my surprise when one of the people stepping out of that car was Rabbi Lara Tessler. I met Lara in 2006 at Temple Beth Torah in Wellington, where she was a nine-year-old member of my Junior Choir. I had the honor of co-officiating her Bat Mitzvah and her Confirmation. Over the years, I watched from afar as she went to college, entered rabbinical school, and eventually became the Associate Rabbi at The Temple in Atlanta. Now engaged and thriving, she radiates joy and purpose. We hadn't seen each other in person since 2017, so our reunion was both joyful and emotional—worthy of a photo of "Rabbi Tessler and Cantor Barry" together at last.



Lunch followed, a tradition for visiting clergy, who often take pictures with their campers. I already knew that most of our Temple Shaarei Shalom kids would be arriving for the second session, so I planned to leave their care packages behind. But I was disappointed to learn that our one first-session camper had gone home early. Then, as if by divine timing, a young counselor approached me, beaming. "Are you from Temple Shaarei Shalom?" she asked excitedly. It was Ellie Bender, a longtime camper and member of our congregation, who had always wished someone from her temple would visit. We chatted, took photos, and I was thrilled to leave her with some surprise gifts and a hug from home.



And then—chaos! The lights went out in the cafeteria, a siren blared, and all the kids erupted in screams

and cheers. The Maccabiah Games had officially begun! Known affectionately as "MAC," it's Camp Coleman's version of Color War and a highlight of the summer. A skit introduced the theme, with counselors dressed as Gru and the Minions from Despicable Me taking over the room. The energy was electric—pure, contagious joy. I felt lucky just to witness it.

As things grew louder, I was gently whisked away on a golf cart for my tour of the camp. The layout reminded me of the summer camp I attended as a child, but the peaceful beauty of the Georgia mountains adds something unique and deeply spiritual to Camp Coleman's atmosphere. My favorite stops were the outdoor worship spaces—one overlooking the lake, the other embraced by forest. I couldn't imagine a more inspiring setting for Jewish youth to connect with each other, their traditions, and their faith.

I always wished my boys had been interested in going away to camp. After seeing Camp Coleman, I'm convinced they missed out on something truly special.

But even if our own summers look different, the values behind Camp Coleman—joyful Jewish connection, community, growth, and tradition—are available to all of us. Whether through synagogue, family, friendships, or moments of quiet reflection in nature, we can all find ways to nourish our spirits and surprise ourselves with unexpected joy.

Religious School

In the last News & Views, I described our new partnership with “Moving Traditions” and the curriculum we will follow for our Post-B’nei Mitzvah (7th/8th) - 10th grade students. This month, I’m excited to talk about 5th-6th-7th grades.

The New Curriculum plans for Holocaust studies in 5th grade. If we did that this year, the 6th and 7th grades would never have studied about the Holocaust here in the temple. That would be a major gap in their Jewish education so for this transitional year, all three classes will participate in Holocaust Studies!

Our approach is to concentrate on the cause and effect of WWII on the Jewish communities throughout Europe. We will focus on individuals who found themselves in very challenging circumstances beyond their control, and who had to decide what to do, how to respond, and how far they would go in order to survive. Some of the “real life” heroes will be studied and the students will try to temporarily step into their shoes and imagine what their life was like.

One of the best ways to truly understand the circumstances is to meet with “survivors” to see and hear authentic memories and stories. This is a great privilege that will no longer be an option for those who are currently in K-3. Thank goodness there are numerous collections of documentation and recordings of survivors’ stories that will become our “go to” in helping students understand the gravity of their situations in the future.

We’re also hoping to recruit a veteran who was in Europe during the war - maybe even somebody who helped liberate the camps! Please talk with your friends and relatives and help find this gem of a person to visit with the classes and tell their stories. A trip to the Holocaust Museum in Miami is included in the plans as well.

One of the culminating activities of the students’ studies is to create their own Holocaust Museum to display to the entire congregation! That is why we’ve put out a

request for authentic WWII artifacts, documents, photos, and ritual objects. Please look around your homes to see if you have anything you could loan to us to help inform the next generation. As many wise people have said, we must know our history in order to prevent it from repeating itself.

The 5th-6th-7th grade will also continue their Hebrew studies but in a new way! We’re using a wonderful Hebrew curriculum called “Hebrew in Harmony.” It will help our students not only be able to read Hebrew prayers and blessings, but also understand their meaning, and the intentions of how they function in the Shabbat service. We’ll be thinking about the prayers and blessings on a deeper level and grow toward understanding deeply, how they can enhance our lives.

Adult Learning & Edutainment

Look for the new brochure coming out at the end of August. We have broadened our selections to include sessions relevant to our lives, body-mind-soul, friendship, Holocaust discoveries years later, Heredity & Cancer, Degas & the Dreyfus Affair, Jewish humor, Shabbat Yoga, Beginner and Intermediate Hebrew and a monthly Rummikub Club, that great game of math-memory-strategy invented by an Israeli! In the creative & culinary arts, there’ll be guided instruction to make the Quintessential Jewish Apple Cake, an adult version of Menorah-Making, the origins of Hamantaschen and how to make the “best” kind, Tropical Nosh and creating your own Miriam’s Cup for your Passover Seder. One speaker will also discuss the cases that are currently before the Supreme Court.

Rabbi Fratello is offering two extended series, “Book of Joshua” and “Pesakh to Shavuot” intensive. Cantor Barry will lead a series on “Portraits of Jewish Women.”

All classes are free to temple members and a small fee for guests from the community! We hope there’s something for everyone!

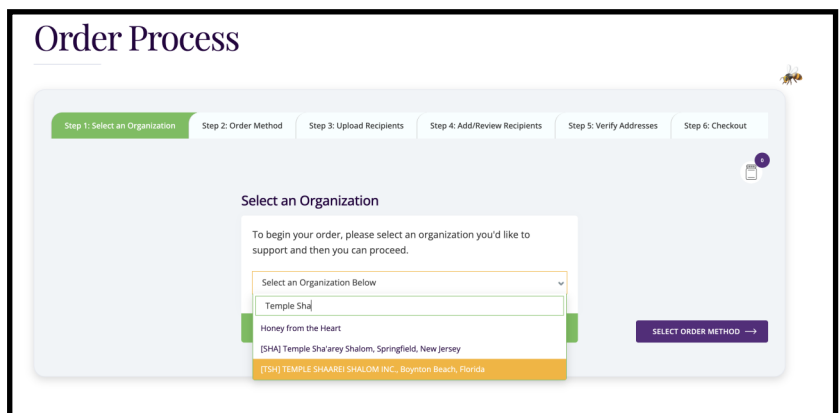

Programming Year Report (September 2024-June 2025)

The Israel Committee's mission is to partner with all groups within the synagogue and larger community who wish to celebrate the modern state of Israel and its many accomplishments. We will offer and promote educational / cultural programming that accurately portray Israel, its history and its importance to Diaspora Jews. We welcome the expression of all viewpoints that support Israel and its right to exist in peace and security with the world community.

We want to thank everyone involved with our Israel Committee. Through your efforts, we were able to present or support a variety of events this past programming year.

September 2024: In conjunction with Congregational Learning, we presented the highly successful Ach Gadol program which was also supported by Brotherhood and with treats from Barbara Weiss. Ach Gadol focuses on supporting Lone Soldiers before, during and after their IDF service. We had multiple speakers and more than 90 in attendance!

October 2024: Our committee met to establish programming goals for the coming year. We viewed a power point on "VOLUN-TOURING" in Israel www.vfi-usa.org. We are proud to report that we have an enthusiastic TSS group traveling to Israel in early September to participate in the "Feed the Soldiers" program. Interested? See Flyer on opposite page.

December 2024: We supported the Congregational Learning Israel program "Elon Perry: 100 Years of Conflict Between Arabs and Jews".

January 2025: *Hummus: THE MOVIE!* was our Sunday afternoon of entertainment where we offered refreshments (you guessed it!) from Pita Lee in Delray Beach. We had 50 in the audience for this fun and informative film.

April 2025: We capped our year with an afternoon of savory and sweet treats, music, singing and dancing in celebration of Yom Ha'Atzmaut—Israel's 77th Independence Day.
