The shofar's call reminds us that life is too precious to live on autopilot. It shakes us awake and asks us to listen, not only with our ears, but with our souls. May these weeks ahead bring you meaning, connection, and peace. May the sound of the shofar awaken in each of us a renewed spirit for the year 5786. And may we enter the new year together with strength, sweetness, and song.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

This month I focus on our 4th grade and tell you about their Jewish Journey this year!

The 4th grade is the year before the students will study The Holocaust, so this is our opportunity to develop their historical perspective. When the Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed in 70CE, the Jews were dispersed and traveled the world to find their new homes. This created what we now know as “the Diaspora.”

The class will focus on two communities, Germany and Spain. When Jews emigrated to different countries, their communities were influenced by those people already there. Their dress, food, music, dance, literature, philosophy, etc. were highly influenced by their experiences and their neighbors.

By comparing Spain and Germany, the class will in essence, discover the core similarities and differences between Ashkenazi and Sephardic Jewry. The groups will explore many different aspects of prayer, worship services, dance, music, food, spices, literature, etc. When they complete the Sephardic unit, their parents will be invited to a Sephardic Havdalah and be impressed by the kids’ skills at dance, song, and public speaking!

When they complete the Ashkenazic unit, they will create and share with their parents, a Hassidic wedding including costume, gender separate dancing, food, songs, and public speaking!

ROSH HASHANAH BALL DROP

On Monday September 22nd, the 4th-7th grade will have a unique opportunity to observe Rosh Hashanah with their peers. They will be involved in a few activities that help them focus on their new year, new opportunities, starting with a clean slate. They will probe some of the high holiday themes on their terms and be philosophers and wrestlers with themes discussed through the ages.

Of course, we’ll end as any new year should end! Many blue and white balls will drop from the ceiling as we cheer “Shanah Tovah! Happy New Year!” Please encourage any 4th-7th grader to join in the fun. See flyer on page 4

From our President

As we approach the High Holy Days, I find myself thinking a lot about the rhythm of our Jewish year. How it gently but insistently calls us to pause, take stock, and re-center ourselves. These sacred days are not just dates on a calendar. They're an opportunity to reconnect with our faith, our values, and one another.

This is my first High Holy Day season writing to you as president, and while I know many of you already, I also know there's still more to share about why I love this community so much. We are more than a building. We are a living, breathing congregation. Temple Shaarei Shalom is a place where relationships are forged, traditions are honored, and the next generation is nurtured in the warmth of Jewish life.

The High Holy Days invite us to do the inner work of cheshbon hanefesh: a spiritual accounting. Every act of involvement adds another layer of strength to our Temple. The High Holy Days remind us that we are all responsible for one another, and, in a world that can sometimes feel fragmented, our synagogue is a rare and precious place where connection, kindness, and meaning still matter deeply.

In a few short weeks, we'll gather in our sanctuary, our voices rising together in prayer. We'll hear the familiar, stirring melodies that have carried our people through centuries. We'll reflect, we'll repent, and we'll renew. But most importantly, we'll do it together — side by side, as members of one family.

From my family to yours, I wish you a Shanah Tovah U'Metukah — a happy, healthy, and sweet new year. May this year bring you peace, joy, and fulfillment. And may we, together, continue to nurture and sustain the incredible community we are so fortunate to call our spiritual home.
