RABBI'S FORUM

It is no wonder that we Jews are sometimes in two minds.

On the one hand, the year has just began. As I am writing these words to you my desk is still playing host to material related to the High Holidays. I've got Sermons to file, notes about what needs to be adapted or changed for our Worship next year. I have a half dozen lovely donations that people made during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur that need to be acknowledged. Moreover, now that the Holidays are behind us, the Programmatic Year can begin in earnest. I started by Adult Ed. Class last this week, and Torah Study just picked up Parashat Bereshit. B'nei Mitzvah Students are coming and Religious School is in full swing.

On the other hand, the year is about to end. November is upon us. Before we know it, it will be Thanksgiving, then Hanukkah, then the New Year. Now all of those little bits and pieces of paper that our Accountants will need in a few short months are starting to come in. I know that our news feeds are filled with the latest from what is transpiring around us, but soon we will be favored with endless "Year End Retrospectives."

It is no wonder that we Jews are sometimes in two minds.

I believe that Thanksgiving is something of an antidote to this, however. As you may or may not know, Thanksgiving—which became a National Holiday during President Lincoln's term—has its origins in the Hebrew Bible. It is thought that "Honest Abe" took inspiration from the Festival of Sukkot. Sukkot which is a Harvest Festival wherein we give thanks for the Produce of our Fields, but we also pause to look ahead to the future.

So too with our American Holiday of Thanksgiving. We at once pause to give thanks for the goodness we have received, the bounties that fill our tables and our homes. But we also take time to ponder what the future will bring. A perfect way for those of two minds to celebrate.

Wherever you may find yourself this Holiday Season, I pray that this is a Season of Thanks and Goodness for you and yours. From our family to yours. A Good Beginning, and a Peaceful Ending.

Cantor's Corner

As those of you who were in attendance for our Kol Nidre service one month ago now, I was given the distinct privilege of delivering the sermon that evening. I spoke about hope and told you this:

“We need hope. It is the fuel for our mental engines. It is what drives us to do pretty much everything. Hope is grounded in the belief that the future will be better than the present and that we can navigate the way there.

And hope is not foreign to us as Jews. It has been our lifeline. Hope kept our ancestors singing Psalms by the rivers of Babylon, imagining return. Hope carried our people through pogroms and expulsions, whispering ‘next year in Jerusalem.’ Hope sustained our families in the ghettos and the camps when all evidence pointed toward despair. And for nearly two thousand years of exile, it was hope that gave Jews the audacity to pray for a return to Zion—and to believe it was possible. Without hope, we would not still be here.”

I believe that. Firmly.

On the day that the remaining hostages were released, I read Eli Sharabi’s book, *Hostage*, in which he recounts his time in captivity in Gaza. The short novel is stunning in its honesty and clarity. The fear of the hostages is palpable, but the shining light of the book is Sharabi’s insistence that maintaining hope would be the key to their survival.

Sharabi’s family had been woken from their beds on the morning of October 7th. Their safe room proved no match for the blood thirsty invaders of Kibbutz Be’eri. Eli was abducted into Gaza but did not learn the fate of his wife and daughters until he was released to the IDF 491 days later. He refused to consider the likely possibility that his wife and two daughters were dead, believing that choosing hope was the only way he could stay alive.

Sharabi was kept with different groupings of other captives during the almost year and a half, including Hersh Goldberg-Polin and Alon Ohel. He became the de facto manager, helping to divide food evenly and to keep peace so as not to draw negative attention. He even taught one of his fellow hostages to read English. Most of all though, he forced them to stay in the world of the living by insisting that they choose hope.

Eli Sharabi was released as part of a hostage deal in early 2024. He was brought to his mother and sister to learn the fate of his family. He was devastated, of course, but he knew that without the hope that his wife and daughters would one day be there to greet him, he would not have made it through the dehumanizing atrocities of the tunnels. We thank you, Eli, for your strength and willingness to share your story with the world.

Even though we are joyous over the return of the hostages, we are still in the midst of trying times. I conclude today as I did on Yom Kippur, “Most of all, choose hope, because above all, we MUST believe that there is a better tomorrow.”

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

Focus on Third Grade

You're in 3rd grade and you are familiar with Jewish prayers, you've heard about Israel, and you know that your family is Jewish. This year, in 3rd grade, you'll get a sense of what that means to you personally and how all the little pieces fit together.

The foundation of the 3rd grade is the biblical foundation of agriculture and how the Jewish calendar is based on the agricultural cycle. It is obvious if one looks for it! The cycle of planting, beginning to grow a crop leading to its harvesting, is directly correlated with Jewish holidays. Sukkot is the most obvious, including the fall harvest as part of the rituals in the Sukkah. In biblical times, the harvest brought everybody to Jerusalem to buy, well, and trade their goods. Conveniently, while in Jerusalem, they heard the reading of the Torah from the High priests at the Temple.

Tu B'shvat, also known as the Birthday of the Trees, is held on the 15th day of the month of Shevat. It's evolved in modern times as the planting and growth of trees in Israel became more and more important on many levels; the need for trees in creating farms and growing fruits as well as in warfare, and in health. In the early 20th century, the Jewish National Fund devoted the day to planting eucalyptus trees to stop the plague of malaria in the Hula Valley; in 1964, an Israeli spy convinced the Syrians to plant trees near military fortifications so that their soldiers had some shelter against the sun. The Israeli's used those trees as targeting markers ensuring a swift victory during the Six-Day War.

The 3rd grade is reading books about agriculture in Israel. They've planted various species of plants that thrive in the desert, and a fun but failed attempt at growing onions, in hopes of having them by Hanukkah for making latkes. They even ventured into Israeli dancing! They learned the "Horah" and soon will be learning the "Mayim" step; mayim means water, an essential ingredient for growing agriculture.

We even parallel the Exodus experience of the Israelites with agriculture: Planting: God's promise of freedom and new life for the Israelites is like planting seeds.

Growth: As the Israelites journey, they experience growth and development, like crops growing in the fields.

Harvest: The Israelites' freedom is celebrated like a harvest, with gratitude and joy for God's provision.

The 3rd grade is pretty fun and who knows, maybe we'll "sprout" a farmer or a gardener, dancer, or arborist!?!? Hopefully, all will grow a love of Israel and our close connection with God, our Gardener as we are the sprouts planted to grow!
