Cantor's Corner

My cousins live in Bondi Beach in Sydney. Not in the suburb, but right there, just off the beach. They are the contingent of our family that chose Australia rather than the United States of America. We reached out to them just after the terrorist attack and were able to confirm that they were all safe. This time. Since October 7, 2023, there has been a 738% increase of antisemitic incidents in Australia.

In this increasingly disturbing moment in history, Jews around the world are asking the same question: "Where next?" And, sadly, the reality is that it can happen anywhere. The Anti-Defamation League is keeping a tally of antisemitic incidents globally and the percentages are astounding. The Netherlands is reporting an increase of 245%, Brazil 961%, France 1000%, Denmark 1244%, just to name a few. These numbers represent acts of vandalism, arson, protesters yelling slurs, and physical attacks. While the world tries to insist that they are "just" anti-Zionist and do not hate the Jewish people, the numbers don't lie. These are not attacks on Israel or proven Zionists, they are simply attacks on Jews.

The blood libel is one of the oldest and most destructive antisemitic myths. It first appeared in medieval Christian Europe in the 12th century, when Jews were falsely accused of murdering Christian children to use their blood for religious rituals, often tied to Passover. These claims were entirely invented as Jewish law strictly forbids the consumption of blood, but they spread anyway, repeated in sermons, stories, and images. When communities were frightened or searching for someone to blame, the accusation offered a ready answer, and it frequently led to violence, expulsions, or worse for Jewish families.

What made the blood libel so powerful was not just the accusation itself, but what it implied. It painted Jews as secretive, dangerous, and inhuman; people who supposedly survived by harming others, even children. That image made it easier for the wider society to justify cruelty. Over time, the details changed, but the basic idea stayed the same. In later centuries, the charge evolved into claims that Jews poisoned wells, spread disease, controlled governments, or manipulated economies. These modernized versions carried the same message and eventually fed into the ideology that made the Holocaust possible.

Today's rise in antisemitism isn't a break from the past so much as a continuation of it. The language is different, and the platforms are new, but the pattern is familiar. Instead of ritual murder, Jews are now accused of engineering wars, profiting from suffering, or deliberately harming civilians and children. Social media and online conspiracy theories have replaced medieval pulpits, but they spread the same old story: that Jews are a hidden, malevolent force behind the world's problems.

Seeing this connection matters. When we recognize that many contemporary antisemitic claims are reworkings of the blood libel, it becomes harder to dismiss them as "just politics" or passing anger. These stories have always had consequences. But history also teaches something else: hiding has never made Jews safer. Each generation has faced these myths in new forms, and each generation has had to decide how to respond.

The answer is not to shrink or disappear, but to stand firm. To name these lies for what they are, to refuse to internalize them, and to remain visible in our Jewish lives with our names, our traditions, our voices, and our values. In moments like this, Jewish continuity itself becomes an act of courage. Standing openly and proudly in Jewish identity is not only a response to hatred; it is a declaration that these ancient falsehoods will not define us or determine our future.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

If you think about it, we adults have started new year's many times over but how do we help a Kindergarten & First Grader understand such a concept? The Gregorian calendar is mathematical, based on earth's cycles around the sun; it's standardized worldwide and structured around a 365-day year. To teach children in Kindergarten and First grade about such things, one must think through a process of understanding what life experiences the children have, how they will see a situation, an idea, a concept, a tradition, and tune into their brain processing to present the matters in a way that they can grasp and internalize them.

We have found that with this particular group of Kindergarten and First Graders in our Religious School, food is a great translator of many concepts! So far in the year, they've found a way to conceptualize Jewish teachings through food!

Sukkot - Graham Crackers are the walls of the sukkah, pretzel sticks are the skakh and rainbow sprinkles are the decorations.

Simkhat Torah - Two Swiss Rolls serve as the scrolls, flat fruit roll-up is the parchment, and pretzel sticks the eitz hayim.

Hanukkah - Marshmallows lined up with pretzel sticks serving as the pretend candles and red icing as the flames.

Hanukkah Model 2 - One dimensional on a paper plate - animal crackers as the menorah base, pretzel sticks lined up as the candles, cheerios as the flames, and

Shabbat - Making traditional Braided Khallah with the help of master chef Cheri Cantor!

Remember, these are very curious kids who may not yet be able to read or write but their sophistication of thought is very high, and they feel comfortable in their warm and friendly classroom.

Food isn't the only motivation! They've also had a visit from the beekeeper for Rosh Hashanah, Rabbi Fratello demonstrated Shofar blowing, with everybody's stuffed animals, they took a ride on an ark! After the ark ride, they interacted with goats, rabbit, guinea pigs, & baby chicks. Their imagination took them into the desert to learn about haknasat orkheem - Hospitality.

Besides the Jewish holidays, the kids have also been exploring the stories of Genesis/B'raysheet. They spent quite a bit of time on the story of Abraham & Sarah's generous hospitality of the three strangers walking past their open tent. The children loved dressing up in their desert/biblical outfits (custom made by Anne Gorenstein) and acting out the story. By taking on different roles, each child had the experience of "trying on" another identity and by pretending to be somebody else, could really grasp the experience the characters in the Torah really had. They were so committed to this story, we invited in parents and grandparents for a hospitality breakfast at which everybody ate pita, naan break, yogurt, and fruit and got to watch the kids act out the story in their costumes. Those were some significant memories made on that morning!



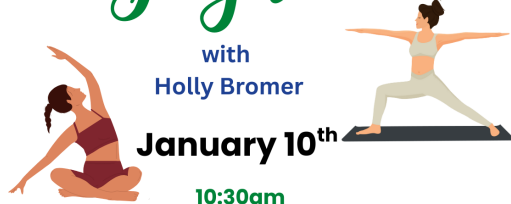
