RABBI'S FORUM

Do you remember the movie Groundhog Day? In case you haven't seen it, or do not remember, Bill Murray plays a weatherman who is inexplicably stuck in a loop. Every morning, he wakes up to the radio playing "I Got You Babe," by Sonny and Cher, and every day it is February 2. The film carries on, of course, Murray's character who starts out as something of an unlovable curmudgeon, ends up being transformed by the experience. He betters himself, becomes a beloved fixture in the town, and falls in love with his news producer, who falls in love with him.

If you read online about the movie, you will find varying estimates of how long Murray spends trapped in the loop. Some suggest 10-years, others as many as 70 or 80. But regardless, every morning he wakes up as the only one who has any memory or knowledge that this day is exactly the same as the day before.

Pause for a moment and ask yourselves: What would you do? What would you do if you woke up every day and it was exactly the same as the day before? Sitting here writing these words there are a handful of days that I think I would enjoy on an endless repeat, but should this ever happen, we probably won't be able to pick the day.

What would you do?

Surely some of us would start as Murray started, we would use the experience of knowing what was going to happen and when to feed our creature appetites. We could lie, cheat, steal, and it wouldn't matter. Eventually, some of us might end up like Murray, suicidal at the thought of having to relive the same day over and over again. In the movie, he conceives of any number of ways to take his only life, only to wake up again, in the same bed, with the same music on the radio.

Eventually, we might come to grips with our strange reality. We might accept its limitations, as well as its possibilities. If the days are the same, how might we use them better? Can we learn a new skill? Can we connect with new people? Can we work toward better our own lives?

Now here is the part that I really want you to consider: Today is February 2—maybe not really, but surely metaphorically. For most of us our days are the same from one to the next. We get up, we go about our

business, we eat the same food, do the same thing, and go to bed. And yet, do we do anything with that time? Do we learn any new skills, do we conquer any new challenges, do we seek to better ourselves in any meaningful way?

Bill Murray's character in the movie had his reasons, and he had his response. What's yours?

"I got you babe—dah dah dah, dah dah dah, dah dah dah—I got you babe..."

Jewish Education “Learning” Looks Different Now than
10-20 Years Ago

Throughout my life I have lived and worked deeply implanted in the Reform Jewish Community. Even as a child I remember adults discussing why it was or wasn't ok for teens to come to Friday night services in their jeans and sneakers; near hysteria when a young adult married someone who wasn't Jewish; and the stereotyped competition between Reform, Conservative, and Orthodox Jews about who is “more Jewish” because of knowledge and practice. The underlying fear was Judaism disappearing.

Ironically, at the end of the 1990's and into the 2000's, the Jewish American communities (outside of Orthodoxy) struggled with gradual reductions of membership and in response, reduced the number of hours per week for educating the next generation. In retrospect, it was a most counterproductive response to a serious concern. Were families dropping their membership because their children's schedules were too demanding? Were the opportunities and demands of excelling in sports, the arts, and academia too powerful to withstand Judaism as an equal priority? Did we ask the families “why” they were choosing to drop their membership?

Many religious schools went from 3-days a week and Sundays, to 2, and then 1 for the years leading to becoming B'nei Mitzvah. This caused a stressful experience for students trying to learn to read Hebrew and chant from the Torah with just a few hours a week of study. Did that stress impact how they felt about congregational life? How so? Some congregations kept Confirmation at 10th grade and welcomed the young High School students into the “Mitzvah” of serving as assistant teachers (madreekheem). Some congregations offered alternative, personal, small group connections through 12th grade meeting together monthly to keep the connection and assist students preparing for the upcoming college and young-adult years.

Some congregations understood that it wasn't only about the number of times a child attends, but what they do in that time together. Creativity was the key to making the time spent productive, constructive, social, academic, engaging, and always “fun.” The field of Jewish Education is relatively small. There are accredited

programs to train directors of education but there were few to train religious schoolteachers. We've had dedicated, caring, determined, kind, skilled teachers in our Religious Schools but few have been the wizards that we needed to collaborate creativity and be effective in “teaching Judaism.” Until now.

What we've been experimenting with and developing here has been a work in progress. It's a multi-year progression through time for children starting in kindergarten through 10th grade to learn about the 5000-year journey of our Jewish People. We're less interested in them knowing dates and statistics, and more interested in them understanding that we are a People that has traveled the world by choice and by force; we have shared our values, culture, and rituals and been influenced by other People's cultures as we settled in new lands during eras of varying powers at the helm. Our students “witness” personal stories of struggle for individuals with really tough choices. They enjoy the tastes, smells, harmonies and joys of Jewish food, Jewish music, Jewish song, and Jewish dance.

When anthropologists, sociologists, and historians' study past cultures, they look for indications of how a People spent their time and money, what engaged them spiritually and ritually. In Religious School, we are simultaneously studying those patterns, trying them on for ourselves, and as a community, choosing current and future choices of culture. We may be the “People of the Book” but the experience of writing and reading that book is through our deep culture, rich history, and the emotional and spiritual needs of the heart, mind, and soul.



From our President

February is a curious month. It's short, often cold, and easy to overlook, but it's also when intentions quietly turn into habits. By now, the resolutions of January have either taken root or fallen away. At Temple Shaarei Shalom, I see February not as a pause, but as a proving ground: a time to ask whether our values are simply words, or whether they are shaping how we show up for one another.

Over the past months, we've been talking openly about the future of our sanctuary and our community. These conversations matter, because they force us to confront an honest question: what kind of Jewish home do we want to sustain, not just for ourselves, but for the generations who will walk through our doors long after we are gone?

A synagogue is more than a building. Let's be clear: it is not insignificant either. Our physical space tells a story. It signals whether we expect people to linger, to pray deeply, to feel pride in calling this place their own. Investing in our sanctuary is not about aesthetics alone; it is about alignment. When our space reflects our values, it strengthens our sense of belonging and purpose.

February also invites us to think about love in a broader sense than the commercial version on display this month. In Jewish tradition, love is action. It is consistency. It is choosing community even when life is busy and attention is divided. Every committee meeting attended, every program supported, every conversation had with curiosity instead of assumption; these are acts of love. I encourage you this month to take a small but intentional step toward deeper engagement. Attend a program you've never tried. Reach out to someone you haven't seen in a while. Ask a question about where Temple Shaarei Shalom is headed, and how you might help shape that path.

The future of our congregation will not be determined by one campaign, one project, or one group of leaders. It will be built gradually by people who believe that this community is worth investing in, emotionally, spiritually, and yes, materially.

February may be brief, but it is powerful. Let's use it wisely.
