RABBI'S FORUM

On Wednesday, April 1, we will join with legions of other Jewish People across the world to celebrate one of our oldest, and most enduring rituals. When we sit down at the Passover table, and take out our Haggadot, we become yet the next chapter of a tale that stretches back through the mists of time. We pass our living history, we pass our own family history, we pass through generations of history, until we get so far back that it becomes difficult, if not impossible to separate between fact and fiction; the story and the myth.

We all know the story, and even if we do not know the story well, we know the moment of gathering at the Seder Table. I cannot tell you the number of B'nei Mitzvah Students who speak of their connection with Judaism, often casting their experiences through the lens of, "When we all gather for Passover..." Our very history is bound up in this tale.

And yet, this year when we gather at our tables, we will add a measure of uncertainty. These are uncertain and unsettling times that we live in. No doubt, sometime after plagues and salt water, but some point between Dayenu and vacuuming crumbs out of the carpet, our conversation will turn to the state of the Jewish World. What will be with the rise of anti-Semitism? What will be with the War in Iran? Will we inevitably yet again be left holding the bag when everyone goes looking for someone to blame? Curious how the fingers never point to the true guilty parties.

It is in that moment that I need you to stop, and reread the Haggadah; it doesn't matter particularly which part, in truth it is all in there. The rhythms and rituals of Judaism were not conceived because our ancestors were bored and had nothing better to do. They were conceived to help our people handle the difficult burden that being a Jew sometimes is. When we read how it was that God brought our ancestors out of Egyptian Bondage, it is not for us to remember one event that occurred thousands of years ago, to ancestors who's names we've long forgotten. No! We do it because it reminds US, in THIS moment, how it is that God looks out for our people. The story of Freedom and Redemption found in the Passover Narrative is not a history lesson, it is a current events lecture from which we are meant to draw resilience and hope.

Even in the darkest of times.

From our table to yours, from our family to yours, may you have a Zissen Pesakh, and may this season of joy bring gladness to your hearts.

Cantor's Corner

There's something magical that happens when you sit in a theater and the lights go down. The world quiets, the music begins, and suddenly you're not just watching a story; you're inside it. You feel the joy, the heartbreak, the hope. A great Broadway show doesn't just tell a story; it invites you to experience it.

I felt a bit of that magic recently at our Temple's Broadway concert. Standing on stage and looking out at so many familiar, supportive faces, I was reminded that what made the evening so special wasn't just the music—it was the shared experience. We weren't just performing songs; we were creating a moment together, one that connected us through story, memory, and emotion.

And as I've been reflecting on that night, I've realized how much it has in common with one of our most beloved traditions: Passover. The Passover Seder is, in many ways, our original immersive storytelling experience. We don't simply read about the Exodus—we are asked to see ourselves as if we personally went out of Egypt. We taste the bitterness, we lift our cups in joy, we ask questions, we sing. Like any powerful piece of theater, the Seder engages all of our senses and invites us to step into the story. Both on stage and at the Seder table, the goal is the same: not just to remember, but to feel. Not just to observe, but to participate.

That's part of what makes Judaism so enduring. We don't preserve our stories by keeping them at a distance. We keep them alive by retelling them in ways that speak to who we are right now. Each year, the Seder is a little bit different, shaped by the people around the table, the questions that are asked, and the voices that are raised in song.

In that way, our tradition isn't so different from Broadway. The script may be the same, but each performance brings something new. Each telling has the potential to move us, to challenge us, and to connect us more deeply to one another.

As we gather this year for Passover, my hope is that we lean into that experience. That we don't rush through the familiar words but allow ourselves to truly feel them. That we sing a little louder, ask a few more questions, and make space for everyone at the table to find themselves in the story. Because when we do, the Seder becomes more than a ritual. It becomes something transformative: a

moment of connection, of memory, and of shared story that stays with us long after the final song is sung.

And maybe that's the real magic, not just of Broadway, and not just of Passover, but of what we create together as a community. Wishing you and yours a Chag Sameach and a Zissen Pesach!

Purim and Passover really challenged us this year! The moment we finished with Purim, we began planning for Passover! Literally! With Spring Break in March, we had just one week to prepare for Passover!

On March 29, the K-4 classes participated in our first "Passover Fair." Thanks to a small group of volunteer parents, we offered 14 stations of learning and activities, reflecting the 14 steps of a Passover Seder. The morning began with a dramatic telling of the Passover Story by Rabbi Fratello! Then the children moved freely through the stations, each with an empty bag which they filled by the end of the morning with their own original works of art!

They went home well-equipped for Passover having learned the Kiddush for the 4 cups of wine/juice, and original works:

Self-made matza-themed table card with their greeting.

A mosaic matzah plate fashioned after archeological pictures found in Israel.

A colorful picture of Joseph & his amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat

(Joseph got us started in Egypt in the first place).

A white sash with a funny Passover saying ("I have more than 4 Questions!" "Matzah-The Original Fast Food" - "Afikomen Search Squad").

A pillow for leaning.

A recipe and a sampling of charoset.

A personal Passover apron with a funny saying ("I have more than 4 Questions!" - "How Does Moses Make Coffee? Hebrews It!" - "Not Today Pharaoh!").

An afikomen bag.

An Elijah Cup.

A photo of themselves crossing the Sea of Reeds with Moses and the Israelites.

A Magen David/Jewish Star necklace.

In April the 5th-7th graders will gather for a Chocolate Seder led by Cantor Barry. Who needs wine when you can have chocolate milk? Many chocolate seders have been in play around the country as a fun parallel seder experience. Simple substitutes for the traditional symbols intrigue the age group and fuel their enthusiasm. Imagine a chocolate egg, sour candies for the bitter herbs, a chocolate dipped strawberry for the green karpas, charoset made from chocolate pudding, mini marshmallows, and mini chocolate chips, and of course,

chocolate matzah! It will be memorable, for sure!

Soon we will celebrate Israel on Yom HaAtzma'ut! We'll have a life-sized map of Israel to explore, a life-size Kotel/Western Wall, some Israeli delicacies, folk dance, and music! In TSS Religious School, there's never a dull moment!

We hope each and everyone has a Zissen Pesach.

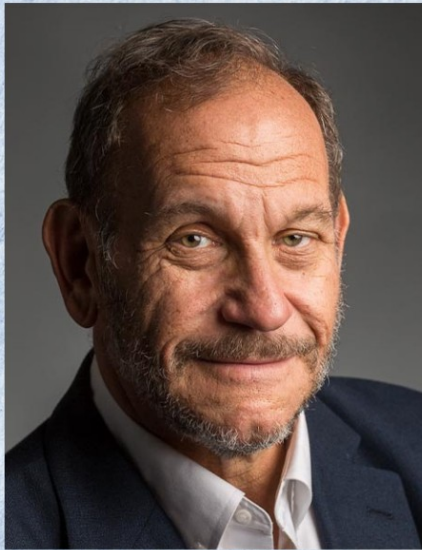
