# RABBI'S FORUM

For many of us, May is a time of year when things start to wind down. Many of our “Snowbird” friends and neighbors head back up-North. Don’t believe me? Check out the reduced traffic on Hagen Ranch Road! For parents of youngsters May means that school is winding down; thoughts turn to summer plans: camp, vacations, sunscreen! For us here at TSS, May also means things are going to wind down, but... we are still busy busy busy!

We will be celebrating the Holiday of Shavuot at the end of the Month. Shavuot commemorates when God gave Moses and the Children of Israel the 10 Commandments when they were gathered at the foot of Mt. Sinai.


On the Festival Calendar Shavuot is considered one of the Three Pilgrimage Festivals: That is to say, in the old days on Shavuot, Sukkot, and Pesakh, our ancestors made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem to worship and offer sacrifice at the Temple. Of course, we do not do this anymore (those of you who are attending my Adult Ed on Evolution of the Prayer Service and the Prayerbook know why!), but the Holiday still has a special place in our tradition.

Because it commemorates the giving of the 10 Commandments, our Shavuot celebrations have always brought an element of study with it. Shavuot also gives us a chance to study and reflect. As in years past we will be joining with our friends from Temple Beth Torah in Wellington for an Erev Shavuot Program and Reception on May 21. This year Rabbi Rosenkranz and I will be reviewing the book/movie “Project Hail Mary.” This work of science fiction by Andy Weir tells the tale of humanity’s first contact with alien life, in the midst of a struggle for our own survival.

In our discussion, we will not only consider the plot and themes of the work but also explore the Jewish Values that run through the story. If you have not read the book, I encourage you to pick up a copy; though the book runs nearly 500 pages, it is a fairly easy read. And/or, if you are so inclined, the movie is still playing in theaters.

# Cantor's Corner

There are certain moments in parenting that feel like they arrive both suddenly and after a lifetime of waiting. This is one of them. My first child is graduation from high school this month and preparing to begin college in June. I find myself standing at that strange intersection of “How did we get here so fast?” And “Wow, look how far we’ve come.”

I’ll be honest. There are a lot of practical questions swirling in my mind. Did we buy everything for the dorm? Will he do his laundry? Does he know that ramen is not a sustainable long-term nutritional plan? But underneath those everyday concerns is a deeper, more meaningful question that I suspect many parents before me have asked: “Have I done what I was meant to do?”

Jewish tradition actually gives us a framework for this. There’s a teaching that outlines a parent’s core responsibilities: to teach Torah, to guide them toward a meaningful life, to help them develop independence, and, famously, to teach them how to swim.

I’ve always loved the “teach them how to swim” part. It’s so wonderfully literal. Yes, we want our children to survive in the water. But of course, it’s also metaphorical. Have we given them the skills to stay afloat in life when things feel overwhelming? Have we helped them build resilience, confidence, and a sense that they can navigate the unknown?

As I look at Blake; cap and gown at the ready, I realize these obligations were never about perfection. They were about presence. About showing up, again and again, in carpools and conversations, in homework help and heart-to-hearts, in setting boundaries and offering unconditional love.

Did I teach him everything there is to know? Of course not. No parents does. And at this point, he’s teaching me things I didn’t know! But I hope I’ve helped him learn how to ask questions. I hope I’ve shown him what it looks like to live with values, to care about others, to find meaning in being part of a community. And perhaps most importantly, I hope he knows who he is.

There is a poignant moment in this transition. Parenting doesn’t end, but it undeniably changes. The hands we once held so tightly are now reaching outward, building a life that is increasingly his own. It is both a letting go and a holding on, just in a different way.

Jewish life is full of rituals that mark transitions, but this one feels a bit more personal, a bit less scripted. There is no single blessing for “sending your child off to college,” though perhaps there should be. If I were to write one, it might include gratitude for the journey so far, a prayer for safety and growth in the journey ahead, and just a hint of a reminder to call home once in a while.

So here we are. A milestone not just for my child, for our entire family. A moment filled with pride, a touch of anxiety, a lot of love, and yes, maybe a few extra phone chargers packed “just in case.”

Have I fulfilled my parental duties according to Jewish tradition? The honest answer is I have tried. And now, it is time to trust that those years of trying have given Blake what he needs to step forward into the next chapter.

And if nothing else...he really does know how to swim.

# Director of Congregational Learning

I have the good fortune of taking time to reflect on my work of the past two years and all that was learned, both for us administrators-teachers and parents-children and adult learners. We all have a tendency of taking all that we have for granted; this is our human nature. But we are well aware that there are thousands of people in the world who do not have the privileges and opportunities that we have on a daily basis. Perhaps if we remind ourselves and each other of our good fortune, we could appreciate our lives a bit more.

In these two years as your Director of Congregational Learning, I have coordinated a series of varied speakers and teachers for adult learning & edutainment. Some have been well attended, and some have not. We learned that people in their mature years are very interested in enjoying learning, growing, and being entertained. It's a rare speaker that can accomplish all three at once. The classes taught by Rabbi Fratello and Cantor Barry have been the most popular and most consistently attended. That's wonderful because that's something you can't really get anywhere else, making TSS a top contender for people's time and attention! Also, the topics they've chosen to speak about are interesting to the community and a passion of their own. Our Adult Hebrew classes taught by Judy Rosmarin have been steadily attended and enjoyed. The groups are small but mighty and it's very special to hear Hebrew spoken around the temple building.

The majority of our mature adults live in active communities with many activities and events every day. There are so many choices. What we offer must be exceptional. So, less offerings of higher quality is the bottom line. We can do that!

Our Youth Groups programs are well on their way of being revived! The participation in fun, social, active events have been well attended by 2nd through 7th graders. 2nd graders starting youth grouping so early in their scheduling patterns helps them build community, intensify their temple friendships, and their perception of temple as a second home. We attribute this increasing success to the fun, consistent, well-planned programming of our Youth Advisor, Taylor Forster. Taylor has crafted a series of activities and established patterns and relationships with the kids to promote attendance. If there are 3 kids or 15 kids, fun is had and memories are made!

The Friday Night Hangouts following our monthly Family Services have been consistently well-attended and great fun. Our kids are on tight schedules all week and having the time and space to just "be" with other friends is a true observance of Shabbat and another way to reinforce the temple friendships and the temple as a second home. The other nice result of this is that the parents hang out and schmooze together for the extra hour of the hangout. We are grateful to have Taylor "on the

job" and continuing to enrich children's lives. If you are a parent, please volunteer to chaperone once or twice a year! It makes all the difference in ensuring our events are safe and ready for anything!

Our Religious School has continued its ongoing evolution. Numbers are important. How many children are in the school matters but it's not the primary goal. We focus on the experiences we offer the children when they're here and how they can feel, hear, see, taste, imagine their Jewish history, their ancestors' life experiences that have led us to today.

Preparation for being active participants in Shabbat services begins in kindergarten. Hearing the sound and rhythm of Hebrew in songs and games serves as a foundation for later Hebrew studies. Becoming familiar with the look, sound, and function of the Hebrew letters in 2nd and 3rd grade, helps to influence learning and how to integrate vowels and form words in 4th grade. Being able to read simple prayers by the end of 4th grade makes 5th grade a productive year of building on knowledge toward fluency. Therning the Hebrew prayers with the appropriate chanting helps students retain the flow of each sentence. Our goal is competency in 5th grade working toward confidence. If we achieve confidence by 6th grade then we can spend time gaining more understanding of the meanings, symbolism, reasons for the prayers, their sequence, and how they teach us and support us through life. If we're able to reach these heights in 6th grade, then 7th grade can be spent on B'nei Mitzvah preparation and getting deeper into the significance of the Torah and Haftarah portions.

This progressive cycle relies on building on skills each year. Being involved with Hebrew once or twice a week is challenging enough. We add in all of the other commitments our students and families have, and the absenteeism really interrupts the flow. This is our reality and our challenge. We just keep trying and moving forward, hoping that the children are internalizing the content and retaining the information.

All in all, what we want for students who move through TSS's Religious School is to know the difference between Ashkenazic and Sephardic, the foundational prayers of our Shabbat service so in their teen and adulthood adventures, they could walk into any synagogue around the world and have a pretty good idea what's going on! We want our children to know why Jewish homes have a mezuzah on the door frame, why Abraham, Isaac & Jacob, Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel, and Leah are our "*avot v'Imahot*." We want them to be able to join in an Israeli dance at an event, where the Jewish Star/Star of David came from, the difference between a bourekka, matzah ball, knadlach, and dumpling at the Chinese restaurant. We want them to be able to know the smell of chicken soup cooking, make a latke,

We are excited to share that the Sanctuary Enhancement Project at Temple Shaarei Shalom is officially underway—and the transformation has already begun.

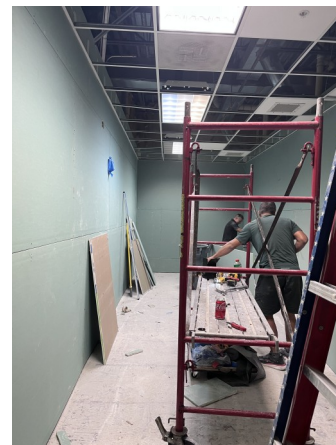

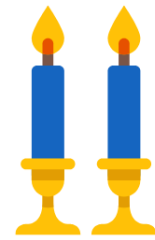

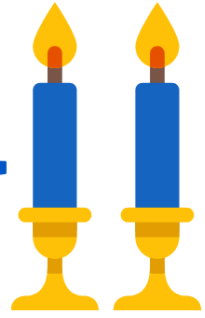
