RABBI'S FORUM

I will be honest with you all, this August feels VERY strange to me. For the first time in 18 years we are NOT preparing a child to begin a new year in school. Now, it is true we are about to send our youngest off to college—which requires a different level or preparation. But for the first time in a long time we are not talking about lunchboxes, and backpacks, and what kind of supplies are on the teacher’s lists.

When I hear “Back to School” ads on the radio or TV, I am filled with both a measure of joy and a measure of wistfulness.

For many of us August is a time of getting ready. We are getting ready to send kids off to their next year of learning, we are getting ready for another year of work post summer and vacation. Many of us are getting ready for football season and are already working on our Fantasy League Football Teams!

In Judaism, August is also a time for getting ready. Tradition teaches us that during Elul—the Hebrew month that more or less coincides with August—we are to engage in Heshbon Ha-Nefesh—we are to “Take Account of our Souls.” Come Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur we will stand before God and confess our sins as we seek atonement and blessing on the New Year. We cannot possibly hope to do this unless we have done some work in advance.

How have we failed?

What ways did we not do our very best?

How many times did we know the proper path to take and yet make other choices?

And most importantly: How can we seek to do better in the year to come?

Many of you are already making your plans for the Holidays. Hopefully you have spoken with Caryn and have your seats all set up. Maybe you’ve discussed what you’d like to do for a Rosh Hashanah Meal. Those of you who are particularly on the ball may even already know what you are going to do for Break the Fast (to join us see flyer on page 13). That is all well and good. But, before any of that, we need all need to do the difficult work of getting ready for what the High Holidays are all about. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are about taking a hard look at our lives and determining in what ways we might make them better. That begins with being honest with ourselves about our failures and shortcomings.

The good news, of course, the blessing of Judaism, is that we need not live with the mistakes of our past. We might atone for them and make a better path for ourselves in the future. I hope and pray that this time of Heshbon Ha-Nefesh is a time of spiritual renewal for you. Rabbi Tract, Samson, Eli and I wish you all only the very best in the Year to Come.

Cantor's Corner

As August unfolds, many of us find ourselves standing at a threshold. Summer schedules begin to give way to familiar routines. Children and grandchildren return to school. Vacations become memories. The days seem to move just a little faster. In the Jewish calendar, we stand at a threshold as well.

The month of Elul, which begins this year in August, serves as our spiritual preparation for the High Holy Days. Traditionally, it is a time of reflection, a season in which we begin to examine our lives and our relationships before Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur arrive.

That can sound overwhelming. We may think we are supposed to review every mistake, repair every relationship, and create an ambitious list of resolutions for the year ahead.

But perhaps Elul invites something simpler. What if, instead of making a long list, we asked one meaningful question? Not a question about accomplishments or productivity. Not a question about whether we have done enough. A deeper question.

Perhaps it is: What is calling me home?

Perhaps it is: Where in my life do I most need to grow?

Perhaps it is: Who do I want to be for the people I love?

Or maybe it is simply: What matters most right now?

The Hebrew word teshuvah, often translated as repentance, literally means “return.” The work of this season is not about becoming someone entirely new. It is about returning—to our values, to our relationships, to our purpose, and to the best version of ourselves.

The shofar will soon sound, calling us to awaken. Yet long before that first blast on Rosh Hashanah, Elul offers a quieter invitation. It asks us to listen.

To listen to our hearts.

To listen to those we love.

To listen for God’s presence in our lives.

As we prepare for the New Year together, I invite you to spend a few moments with one meaningful question. Carry it with you on a morning walk, during a quiet cup of coffee, or in a moment of prayer. Let it accompany you through these weeks of preparation.

You may not find an answer right away. That is all right.

Sometimes the question itself is where the journey begins.

May these days of Elul bring reflection, renewal, and the courage to listen for what is calling us home.

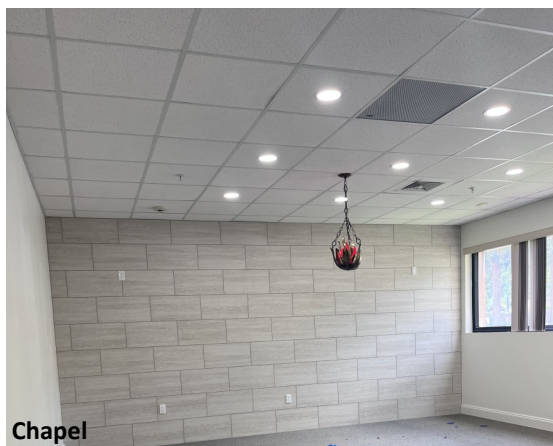

Did You Know? A New Home for Our Holocaust Memorial

Our community has chosen to relocate the **Holocaust Memorial** to a new, more visible, and more accessible site. The redesigned space invites reflection, remembrance, and a shared commitment to moral responsibility. Every element of the memorial has been placed with intention, creating a garden where memory is honored and compassion is cultivated.

Symbolism of the Holocaust Memorial Garden

The Headstone — Naming the Sacred Space

At the center stands a slanted headstone engraved “*Holocaust Memorial Garden.*” Its forward-leaning posture symbolizes the weight of memory — a reminder that the truth of the Holocaust leans into the present and must never be forgotten. It marks the garden as a place of honesty, reverence and historical acknowledgment

The Memorial Stone — In Memory of the 6,000,000

The stone inscribed “*In Memory of the 6,000,000 – Brotherhood 2005*” anchors the emotional core of the garden. It honors the six million Jewish lives taken during the Holocaust and affirms the brotherhood of humanity that must stand united against hatred. Positioned at the entrance, it invites visitors to begin their walk with remembrance.

The Five Camp Stones — Bearing Witness

Five stones encircle the headstone, each engraved with the name of a concentration camp: **Auschwitz, Bergen-Belsen, Treblinka, Dachau, and Buchenwald**. Arranged in a gentle arc, they form a circle of witness — a reminder that the Holocaust was not a single event but a vast, interconnected system of persecution. Each stone stands as a voice for those who can no longer speak.

The Benches — A Moral Journey

Two granite benches frame the garden, guiding visitors through a moral arc:

“**Don’t Hate**” — placed at the entrance, reminding us that hatred is the seed from which violence grows.

“**Never Again**” — positioned at the far end, calling us to leave with renewed resolve to prevent future atrocities.

Together, they transform memory into responsibility.

The Living Garden (yet to come)— Life in the Presence of Loss

The surrounding plants and pathways will offer a quiet refuge. The living garden symbolizes resilience and renewal — life growing alongside memory, not to erase the past but to honor it.

Overall Meaning

The Holocaust Memorial Garden is more than a collection of stones. It is a promise:

To remember those who were lost

To confront the consequences of hatred

To teach future generations

To stand against injustice

To choose humanity, always

*It is a place where silence speaks,
memory lives, and hope endures.*
